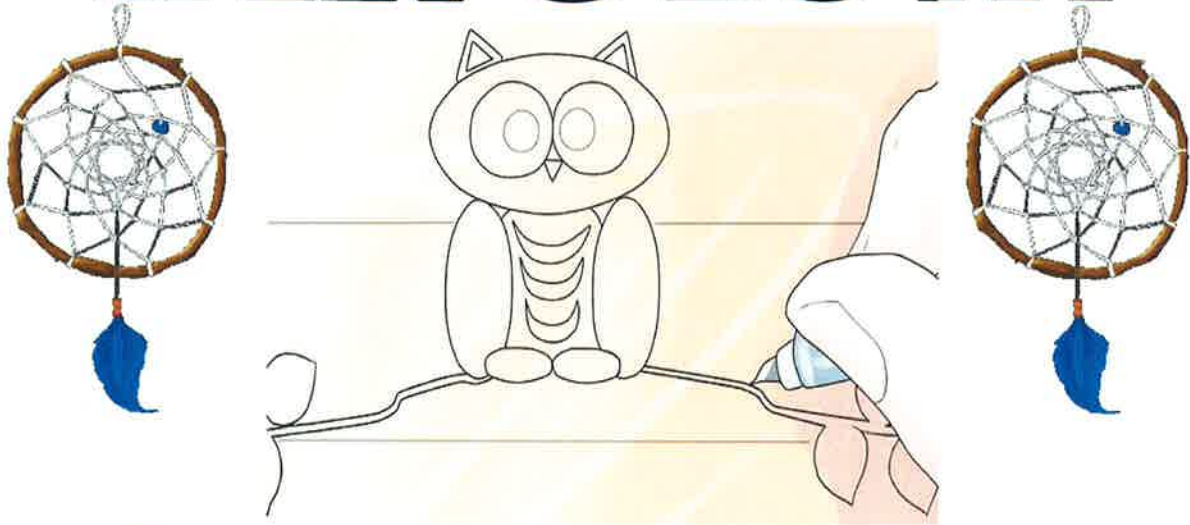

Watershed Conditions Statement - Water Safety Wawa District

NEWS

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) - District is advising area residents that a Watershed Conditions Statement - Water Safety is in effect in the District.

Residents in Wawa District should be aware that conditions could be dangerous for boaters, anglers, swimmers and other recreational users. Although no flooding is anticipated based on current forecasts, special caution should be used around rivers and streams. Please alert any children under your care to these dangers and supervise their activities

MNRF is closely monitoring the weather and developing watershed conditions. Further updates will be issued as appropriate.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Description of Weather System

On Monday April 20, 2015, a weather system is forecasted to bring 5 – 15mm of rain to Wawa District and surrounding area. With the recent warm weather, some of the winter snowpack has been released back into the watershed resulting in a slight increase in water levels in local lakes, rivers, and streams. Nighttime temperatures have been consistently below zero, slowing the rate of melting. For the next seven days, overnight temperatures are expected to remain below zero, and daytime temperatures are forecasted up to 10°C.

Description of Current Conditions

With nighttime temperatures remaining below zero, the rate of melt has not yet reached a critical level. River flows and lake levels are at a seasonal normal. However as temperatures and accumulated precipitation amounts increase, the potential for flooding also increases throughout the district.

EXPIRY DATE

This message will be in effect until (or updated before): Tuesday, April 28 2015, 12:00 PM

TERMINOLOGY: Notification Levels

WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT - FLOOD OUTLOOK: gives early notice of the potential for flooding based on weather forecasts calling for heavy rain, snow melt, high winds or other conditions

WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT – WATER SAFETY: indicates that high flows, melting ice or other factors could be dangerous for such users as boaters, anglers and swimmers but flooding is not expected.

FLOOD WATCH: potential for flooding exists within specific watercourses and municipalities

FLOOD WARNING: flooding is imminent or occurring within specific watercourses and municipalities.
