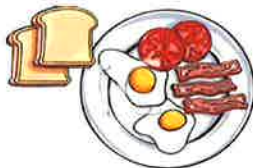

Michipicoten First Nation, Lands and Resources Consultation Coordinator

Overview

Under the direction of the Band Manager, the Lands and Resources Consultation Coordinator will:

- Be responsible for developing and maintaining partnerships with multiple stakeholders with respect to mines, minerals, natural resources, land use and environmental related issues;
- Recognize potential stakeholders include but are not limited to mining and utility companies operating in the Michipicoten First Nation traditional and treaty territory, private business, other First Nation communities and various provincial and federal ministries.
- Build positive relationships with the government agencies, municipalities and private sector interests involved in various consultation requests.
- Organize and facilitate community sessions on consultation requests that are complex and multi-disciplinary in nature.
- Provide reports on new and existing consultation requests to be shared with the Band Manager and/or Chief & Council to facilitate a greater degree of engagement.
- Undertake special projects related to consultation that may be unanticipated but would provide additional benefits to Michipicoten First Nation.
- Work with the Band Manager, other Michipicoten First Nation staff and/or identified outside specialists to facilitate elder and youth mentoring and knowledge-sharing on lands and resources.

Michipicoten First Nation, Aboriginal Family Support & Well-Being Supervisor - 3 Maple

Overview:

Under the direction of the Band Manager, the Aboriginal Family Support & Wellbeing Supervisor is responsible for participating in and ensuring program and service delivery by MFN Staff located at 3 Maple to Michipicoten First Nation citizens as follows, by:

- Addictions counselling and referral services;
- Facilitating the delivery of prevention services by Dilico Anishinabek Family Care as well as other outside collaterals;
- Identifying the prevention needs of the community in cooperation with other service providers and organizations;
- Supporting and supervising Staff at the 3 Maple location;
- Conducting programming at Michipicoten First Nation, and 3 Maple St;
- Coordinating programming and services with Staff on-reserve;
- supporting children and youth in child welfare and youth justice systems and their families;
- Attending court with Clients who request;
- Building on the pre-existing strengths and the skills within the community;
- Being responsible for ensuring there are discussion groups focusing on self empowerment, understanding dependency and resultant hostility and violence, the nature of oppression and how this can be overcome with the understanding of cultural realities;
- Providing public education events focusing on parenting, assisting children through difficult times, developing healthy social/recreational programs for families including children and youth;
- Responding to the developing need for a specific intervention for a community social problem;
- Identifying and coordinating with appropriate external programs and services; and
- Being responsible for administrative duties.

Qualifications:

- Post secondary degree/diploma or equivalent in Family Support Work, Child & Youth Worker or the Social Sciences;
- Related work experience, Program Supervision experience is an asset;
- An understanding of the Child and Family Services Act is an asset;
- Knowledge and understanding of Anishinaabe language, culture and teachings is an asset;
- Knowledge and understanding of First Nation social needs and priorities is an asset;

Summary of Function

The Water Treatment Plant Operator-In-Training is an entry level opportunity to train as a Water Treatment Plant Operator and to obtain your OIT certificate/license.

Water Treatment Plant Operators oversee the activities and processes that go into treating and distributing municipal drinking water. They are responsible for monitoring water quality and play a key role in protecting public health. A CPIC will be required for the successful applicant.

Job Duties (Include but are not limited to)

- Perform laboratory tests, checks and calibrations;
- Use performance control and management systems to ensure plant is operating within accepted standards;
- Perform preventative maintenance diagnostics;
- Monitor, assess and report on equipment performance;
- Maintain documentation of work area activities as required;
- Perform all other duties as assigned.

Qualifications

- Minimum High School Diploma, Post Secondary Degree/Diploma an asset;
- Must possess excellent communication and troubleshooting skills and have an aptitude for mathematics and science;
- High level of integrity and work ethic;
